## The Kitchen Cabinet

**The "Best Berry" Dishes**  
The strawberry will soon be plentiful, yet while it is still a luxury we may use them in small amounts for a garnish or accessory.

**Devonshire Pie** - Line a pie plate with rich pastry and bake it. Also bake a two-inch ring; this may be made by cutting around a large pie plate to make a large circle and then cutting around a smaller plate placed in the center of this. Use care to handle the ring without breaking it. Fill the pastry shell with Devonshire cream. This is prepared by scalding the milk the day before then skinning the cream and whipping it. Add a cupful or more of sweetened, very ripe

berries and cover with the ring. Heap cream in the center and serve. A most attractive dish and one that is not hard to prepare.

**Strawberry Baskets** - Beat the yolks of four eggs until thick, add one cup of sugar and beat two minutes, the sugar should be added gradually; add three tablespoonfuls of water. Put one and one-half tablespoonfuls of cornstarch in a measuring cup and fill up with flour. Mix and sift with one and one-fourth of a teaspoon of salt, and add to the first mixture. Fold in the whites of the eggs beaten stiff and add one teaspoonful of lemon extract. Fill buttered gem pans and bake in a moderate oven. Cool and

scoop out the centers and fill with sweetened crushed berries mixed with whipped cream.

**Bomb Mousseline** - Line a mold with strawberry ice and fill with the following mixture: Beat one cupful of heavy cream until stiff and add three-fourths of a cupful of powdered sugar, one cupful of strawberry puree, one tablespoonful of orange juice and a teaspoonful of vanilla. Cover with the strawberry ice and overflow, adjust the cover and pack in ice and salt using equal parts, let stand two hours.

## AG Derek Schmidt: Second Amendment Rights Extend Outside the Home

The constitutional right to keep and bear arms extends outside a person's home, Kansas Attorney General Derek Schmidt this week told the U.S. Supreme Court.

At issue in the case is a New York City law that prohibits an individual who has obtained a license to own a firearm in their home from transporting that firearm anywhere, even if locked and unloaded, except to one of the shooting ranges located within city limits. Under the ordinance, it is illegal for a New York resident to transport a firearm to a shooting range in a nearby state.

In the legal brief filed this week, Schmidt along with 21 other state attorneys general and the governors of Kentucky and Mississippi, asked the U.S. Supreme Court to reverse a ruling by the 2nd U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals upholding the city

ordinance. The attorneys general argue the ordinance unconstitutionally restricts the right to use a firearm for self-defense and defense of family outside of the home, restricts the right to travel and discriminates against interstate commerce.

"If New York's regulatory scheme is allowed to stand and is copied by cities around the United States, it would undercut the ability of individuals to travel with their individual rights intact and also threaten state economies dependent upon tourism dollars," the attorneys general wrote.

The case is New York State Rifle & Pistol Association Inc. v. City of New York, New York, No. 18-280. A copy of the states' brief is available at <http://bit.ly/2Qem0qR>. The Supreme Court is expected to hear oral argument on the case in the fall.

## U.S. Beef Gains Full Access to Japan

Today, U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Sonny Perdue announced the United States and Japan have agreed on new terms and conditions that eliminate Japan's longstanding restrictions on U.S. beef exports, paving the way for expanded sales to the United States' top global beef market. Last week, Secretary Perdue met with Japanese government officials and affirmed the importance of science-based trade rules. The new terms will take effect immediately and allow U.S. products from all cattle to enter Japan for the first time since 2003. Today's announcement will hopefully place a path forward for other markets around the globe to accept science-based policies.

## Kansas Honey Production

Honey production in 2018 from Kansas producers with five or more colonies totaled 365,000 pounds, down 34 percent from 2017, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service.

There were 5,000 honey producing colonies in Kansas during 2018, down 29 percent from 2017.

Average yield was 73 pounds per colony, down 6 pounds from 2017. Producer stocks were 95,000 pounds on December 15, 2018 down from 260,000 pounds a year earlier.

Prices for the 2018 crop averaged 300 cents per pound, down from 403 cents in 2017. Prices were based on retail sales by producers and sales to private processors and cooperatives. Total value of honey produced in 2018 was \$1.10 million, down 51 percent from 2017.

## China Negotiations Stall

After the U.S. announced tariff increases from 10 to 25 percent on \$200 billion worth of imports from China on Friday, China announced retaliation on more U.S. goods on Monday. The duties will go into effect June 1, 2019. Sorghum is not included in the list. Both sides have announced an exemption process whereby products subject to the increased tariffs may avoid duties. Tariffs total an annual trade value of an estimated \$300 billion. With this latest announcement, virtually all remaining imports from China would be subject to additional tariffs. The Office of the United States Trade Representative is seeking public comments and will hold a public hearing in June. National Sorghum Producers remains hopeful both parties return to negotiations soon.

## Kansas Crop Progress and Condition

For the week ending May 19, 2019, there were 3.8 days suitable for fieldwork, according to the USDA's National Agricultural Statistics Service. Topsoil moisture supplies rated 0 percent very short, 2 short, 71 adequate, and 27 surplus. Subsoil moisture supplies rated 0 percent very short, 1 short, 76 adequate, and 23 surplus.

Field Crops Report: Winter wheat condition rated 2 percent very poor, 8 poor, 30 fair, 46 good, and 14 excellent. Winter

wheat jointed was 95 percent, equal to last year. Headed was 61 percent, behind 67 last year, and well behind 83 for the five-year average.

Corn planted was 61 percent, behind 80 both last year and average. Emerged was 37 percent, behind 53 both last year and average.

Soybeans planted was 17 percent, well behind 47 last year, and behind 29 average. Emerged was 6 percent, behind 19 last year, and near 10 average.

Sorghum planted was 3 percent, near 7 last year and 6 average.

Cotton planted was 18 percent, behind 26 last year, but near 14 average.

Sunflowers planted was 1 percent, behind 6 last year, and near 3 average.

Pasture and Range Report: Pasture and range conditions rated 0 percent very poor, 3 poor, 26 fair, 57 good, and 14 excellent.

## Crop Update

Twenty-four percent of the nation's sorghum acreage was planted by May 12, eight percentage points behind the previous year and 9 points behind the 5-year average. Texas had planted 75 percent of its intended sorghum acreage by week's end, 10 percentage points behind last year and 1 point behind average.

## Industrial Hemp Conference

Attend the Industrial Hemp Conference Wed., May 22 from 8 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the Pratt County Fairgrounds.

If you're a farmer considering planting and producing hemp or a company that provides services to farmers and producers, consider attending the conference. It costs \$25 and includes breakfast and lunch.

## Second Round of Trade Payments

The Trump Administration is working to release a second round of assistance payments to support farmers affected by China trade tariffs and stalled negotiations. USDA officials have estimated payments will range between \$15-\$20 billion to the U.S. ag sector. Secretary Perdue noted the second round of payments will likely be more direct payments and commodity purchases. National Sorghum Producers continues to provide information to USDA as they craft the new package. Per President Trump's request, the USDA is working quickly to roll out the new plan. Reports indicate an announcement could come out next week.

The Kansas Farm Bureau member health care benefit plan became law in April thanks to the hard work of our members.

We know county Farm Bureaus, members and agents are excited and ready to learn more. This five-minute video featuring Terry Holdren, KFB CEO and General Counsel, provides an overview of the timeline and program roll out.

Plans are currently in development and Farm Bureau Financial Service agents will begin receiving training to offer the benefit. Plans will be available for purchase starting in October and go into effect Jan. 1, 2020.

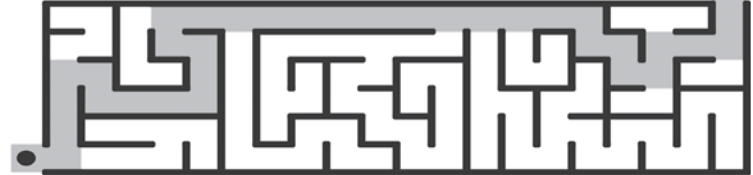
